### **Bridgewater City Council Regular Meeting Minutes** October 5, 2011 7:00 pm

The City Council of the City of Bridgewater met in the Council Room for their regular meeting on 9/08/11. The City Council meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President George Guenthner. Answering roll call were Bob Anderson, George Guenthner, Phil Heiberger, and Verlyn Hudson. Absent: Mayor Ron Pringle, Zach Guenthner and Caron Neumann. The minutes of the September 8<sup>th</sup> regular meeting was sent to the council for reading prior to the meeting. Motion by Hudson, second by Heiberger to approve the minutes of the September 8<sup>th</sup> regular meeting. Motion carried.

The September Financial statement was sent out to the council for reviewing prior to the meeting. After discussion a motion was made by Heiberger, second by Hudson to approve the September Financial Statement. Motion carried.

The bills for the month of September were reviewed. After discussion a motion was made by Anderson, second by Heiberger to approve the September bills. Motion carried.

### Maintenance report by Todd Letcher:

Working on the soft spots on Poplar Ave. CMC had to come and dig out the "mucky, soft stuff". Council consensus was to do whatever is needed to get the street repaired right.

At 7:15 council recessed and reconvened as Board of Adjustment to hold hearing for a Public Hearing on a variance request for Robert & Janet Stahl. No concerns were noted from any visitors on a 5½ foot variance from street setbacks on the west side of the shed and a 10 foot variance from property line setbacks on the east side of same shed for Robert & Janet Stahl. Motion by Heiberger, seconded by Anderson to pass Resolution #11-1005A for Robert & Janet Stahl's variance. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

- Jim Julson addressed the council for the ambulance. It appears that someone had gotten into the ambulance and gone thru some things. It has been suggested by some ambulance personnel that the keyless entry locks be changed/recoded. It was brought up that this is something that should be addressed by the firehall board. The council recommends that these locks be changed immediately in order to protect our ambulance and fire equipment.
- Randy Byington addressed the council about disconnecting the water and sewer connection at 730 N
  Main Ave. The house is not habitable no longer. Motion by Anderson, second by Hudson to allow the
  water and sewer connection at 730 N Main Ave be disconnected. Motion carried.

### **Old Business/Committee Reports**

Streets & Alleys: street load limits were discussed

<u>Water & Sewer:</u> Vern Arens went thru the plans for the Main Street Sewer Project. Questions were asked about how much of the asphalt from 7<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> on Main would be torn up and how to replace it. Right now we are looking at December 12<sup>th</sup> for bid opening. He will be more documents to the November meeting.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BRIDGEWATER TO AMEND SECTION 8.0208A SEWER USER FEE SCHEDULE AND PROCESS

(FLAT RATE STRUCTURE).

**WHEREAS** SDCL 9-48-26 provides for the sewer rates to apply to all users, including but not limited to residential including apartments, public, and commercial users: and

**WHEREAS** the City of Bridgewater sewer charges shall fall due on the first day of each month and payable before 15 days after: and

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the following sewer rates become effective January 1, 2012, payable February 1, 2012, and shall be as follows: the minimum monthly rate shall be \$22.75 plus \$.015 times the cubic feet of water used based on the average monthly usage during the six winter months. In situations where no water is used during the winter months, a fair compensation to the city will be determined by the Municipal Finance Officer.

<u>Government Buildings/Municipal Liquor Store:</u> The check for the hail damage to the liquor store roof has been received. Council decision to not do anything with the roof until maybe next year. The final paper work for hail damage to the rest of the buildings has not been received yet.

<u>Ambulance:</u> Grant papers from the American Heart Association & Helmsley Grant for the 12 lead EKG monitor were received today. As time is an issue in the signing of these papers, a motion was made by G Guenthner, seconded by Anderson that contingent upon the approval from the city attorney that we sign these papers so as not to lose this grant money for the 12 lead EKG monitor cost of \$26,214.50. Motion carried.

Fire: Anderson and Heiberger volunteered to be the council representatives on the firehall board.

<u>Contracted Law Enforcement:</u> monthly report was noted. Sheriff Norris was here to answer any questions. <u>Code Enforcement:</u> Hudson brought up some dog issues and also the suggestion of putting a reminder of pet licensing in our water books for 2012. Council agreed that this was a good idea.

<u>Parks & Rec.:</u> park benches were looked at for the city park. Motion by G Guenthner, seconded by Anderson to purchase one of the 8 foot benches for the city park. Motion carried.

### **New Business:**

Council OK'd the finance officer going to Election Workshop in Sioux Falls on December 8.

1<sup>st</sup> reading of Supplemental Appropriations Ordinance A-87 was done.

Motion by Anderson, second by Heiberger to approve building permit for Robert & Janet Stahl. Motion carried.

Motion by Anderson, second by Heiberger to go into Executive session for Employee Negotiations (SDCL 1-25-2.4). Motion carried. Time 8:10 pm. President Guenthner declared over at 8:20 pm. Employees were thanked for their work. Motion by Guenthner, second by Heiberger effective 1/1/12 to change the employee vacation to read that 0 to 3 years = 5 days per year, 4 to 10 years = 10 days per year and 11 or more = 15 days of vacation and also to change the employee holiday schedule to follow the Federal Holiday schedule. Motion carried.

Motion by Anderson, second by Heiberger to adjourn. Motion carried. Time 8:30 pm.
