The City Council of the City of Bridgewater met in the Council Room for their regular meeting on Wednesday 9/08/2021. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President Travis Holthaus. Answering roll call were Bob Anderson, Tony Hofer, Travis Holthaus, Alicen Strombeck, and Mark Vondra. Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

No appointments for Mayor and Ward III.

The minutes of last month's meetings were sent to the council for reading prior to the meeting. Motion by Strombeck, second by Vondra to approve the August 9<sup>th</sup> regular meeting. All voted aye. Motion carried.

The August Financial statement was sent out to the council for reviewing prior to the meeting. After discussion, a motion was made by Hofer, second by Anderson to approve the August Financial Statement. All voted aye. Motion carried.

The bills for the month of August were reviewed. A motion was made by Hofer, second by Vondra to approve the August bills. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Maintenance Report by Letcher. 1) Mowing & cleaning gutters 2) Jerico Shape – summer help is done for the summer 3) city portion of the sewer line discussed for the Seed Mill new building – CMC has been notified 4) SD DOT has an asphalt heater trailer for sale. Hot mix asphalt is quite a bit cheaper than the cold mix asphalt, so a trailer like this would come in handy to keep the hot mix hot when doing repair work. Motion by Anderson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Hofer to allow spending up to \$6000 for the asphalt heater trailer depending on its condition. All present voted aye. Motion carried

Streets & Alleys: Holthaus brought up that if the city is interested, he may know of where we may be able to get some asphalt millings for \$9 per ton for street work. Trent Bruce - DGR brought up that sometimes they mix the asphalt millings with gravel to be more workable for street work. Council consensus was that it would be a good idea to look into.

No one came to express any comments or concerns. At 7:17 Public Hearing was declared over.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Bridgewater has published and mailed said notices as required by the South Dakota Codified Laws; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Bridgewater has adopted Resolution #20-0406, a Resolution of Necessity, on April 6, 2020 to assess substantial improvements to 4<sup>th</sup> Street from Spruce Avenue to Cedar Avenue; Cedar Avenue from 4<sup>th</sup> Street to 5<sup>th</sup> Street; 5<sup>th</sup> Street from Cedar Avenue to Juniper Avenue; Juniper Avenue from 5<sup>th</sup> Street to 6<sup>th</sup> Street; 6<sup>th</sup> Street from Juniper Avenue to ½ Block east of Poplar

Avenue, Main Avenue from 6<sup>th</sup> Street to ½ Block North of 7<sup>th</sup> Street; and Poplar Avenue from 6<sup>th</sup> Street to ½ Block South of 5<sup>th</sup> Street., all within the City of Bridgewater, South Dakota; and **WHEREAS**, the City of Bridgewater has adopted Resolution #20-0706, a Resolution of Necessity, on July 6, 2020 to assess substantial improvements to 4<sup>th</sup> Street from Spruce Avenue to SD Hwy 262, all within the City of Bridgewater, South Dakota; and

**WHEREAS**, the costs of \$25.00 per foot have been assessed against all assessable lots & tracts of land fronting or abutting the project thereon, according to the provisions of SDCL 9-43; and **WHEREAS**, the assessment roll specified in "Exhibit A" has been filed in the office of the Municipal Finance Officer on August 25, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Bridgewater has reviewed the assessment roll (Exhibit A) and found it to be correct and has held the required public hearing prior to the adoption of this resolution;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the assessment roll for 2020 Phase 1 Storm Sewer Improvements Project is approved and that the assessments may be paid without interest to the Municipal Finance Officer at any time within 30 days after the approval of the assessment roll. The assessments will be collected under Plan One and will become due and payable at the office of the county treasurer in ten installments, together with interest at 3.5 percent per annum, with the general taxes and will be payable at the county treasurer's office on January 1, 2022; the remaining installments with interest at 3.5 percent annum will become due and payable on an annual basis at the county treasurer's office on January 1, of each following year until the total assessment, with interest is paid in full. All installments paid before their respective due dates shall be paid in inverse order of their due dates.

Public Input: No one here with any comments.

Fire Dept: Matt Kroger was here representing the Fire Dept. They purchased 3 new SCDA with the proceeds from the Fireman's Ball last year and still need more. They are asking for a donation from the city. A motion was made by Anderson, second by Hofer to donate \$1500 to the Fireman's Ball using the budget funds in Promoting the City department. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Storm Sewer Project: Trent Bruce-DGR Engineering discussed Change Order #3. This change order basically balances out the final bid quantities to exactly what was used within the scope of the project. Motion by Strombeck, second by Hofer to approve & sign change order #3. All voted aye. Motion carried. Motion by Pay Request #8 was discussed next. This is for all work done by First Rate Excavate Inc up to June 3<sup>rd</sup>. The amount due is \$2,460,390.77 less previous payment of \$2,011,931.23 and \$20,000.00 (retainage) which equals \$428,459.54 for Pay Request #8. Motion by Strombeck, second by Hofer to approve Application for Payment #8 of \$428,459.54 to

First Rate Excavate Inc. All voted aye. Motion carried. Motion by Hofer, second by Vondra to authorize President Holthaus to sign the State Revolving Fund Loan - reimbursement request #9 for the SRF Ioan. All voted aye. Motion carried. Motion by Strombeck second by Vondra to authorize President Holthaus to sign the CDBG payment request #8. All voted aye. Motion carried. Motion by Hofer, second by Strombeck to authorize President Holthaus to sign the CDBG payment request #8. All voted aye. Motion carried. Motion by Hofer, second by Strombeck to authorize President Holthaus to sign the Certificate of Substantial Completion and Davis-Bacon Act Certification. All voted aye. Motion carried. Several items that still need final completion and were discussed.

Bruce & LaVoy went over costs of the areas to continue the storm sewer work discussed at the August meeting in order to take advantage of the American Rescue Plan Act funding that will be coming available to cities for broadband, water and sewer infrastructure projects. The areas included are the outfall line to the lagoon, Poplar Ave, and some east side drainage especially around 3<sup>rd</sup> & Oak Ave & park area. We will never have another opportunity to have this type of funding in getting these storm sewer projects along with streets fixed/resurfaced done. The state needs to have some ideas in knowing what & how much or how many of these types of projects are out there to use this money. None of this commits us to doing anything but it does put our "name out there" as to wanting our share of this ARPA funding instead of it going to another town. Getting our application into the State Water Plan is where we start. Motion by Strombeck, second by Vondra to proceed with getting on the State Water Plan. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Parks & Rec: Anderson & Letcher brought up that according to Mr Bailey, the school will help pay for the gravel needed to level out the parking lot at the ball field. They are thinking it would be nice to have done before the homecoming football game. Motion by Hofer, second by Strombeck to grade & level out the parking lot by the ball field & football field. Roll Call vote: Anderson– abstain, Hofer–aye, Holthaus-aye, Strombeck–aye, Vondra–aye. Motion carried.

Health & Landfill: dump/tree site DANR inspection report was noted

Government Buildings/Municipal Liquor Store: It was noted that there was an attempted break-in to the back door of the bar. It was reported to the Sheriff Dept.

Law Enforcement: July report so noted.

Code Enforcement: clean-up notice for property at 100 & 120 S Oak Ave will be sent Planning & Zoning: JoJae Glanzer spoke to the council about a McCook County Drainage Permit Acceptance Form for Donna Glanzer's property south edge of town that his tiling will drain into. Motion by Hofer, second by Vondra to sign the McCook County Drainage Permit Acceptance Form for Donna Glanzer. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Motion by Anderson, second by Vondra to approve the building permit for Linda Richards. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Second reading of the 2022 Budget Ordinance was done and motion by Strombeck, second by Anderson to pass 2022 Appropriation Ordinance A-113. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Auditor findings for the 2019 & 2020 audit were noted.

Correspondence from Attorney Gerlach asking about a settlement for a past due delinquent water/sewer bill at 551 E 2<sup>nd</sup> St. Attorney Gerlach is representing a person interested in purchasing this property and asking to negotiate a delinquent water/sewer bill on this property. After discussion, a motion was made by Anderson, second by Vondra to settle for \$1000 on the delinquent water/sewer bill at 551 E 2<sup>nd</sup> St. All voted age. Motion carried. Council felt getting this property as contributing to our utilities instead of sitting delinquent was in the best interest of the city.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Strombeck, second by Vondra to adjourn. Motion carried. Time 9:26 pm.
